

Enrollment Trends


Data on enrollment trends are an important indicator for overall institutional health in higher education. Enrollment numbers have been fluctuating due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and other factors such as demographic changes and institutional competition. This is especially true of those areas, such as the northeast corridor of the United States, which has been historically saturated with public and private educational institutions. Future data will assist the College in understanding post-pandemic enrollment.


Unduplicated Headcount by Fall Term


Unduplicated Total Headcount by Fiscal Year





Average Class Size by Campus











Average Age by Campus and Fiscal Year





Median Age by Campus and Fiscal Year












Dual Enrollment Students

Traditional Dual Enrollment provides an opportunity for high school students to take college courses while still enrolled in high school. This provides a benefit to those students as the courses they take are credit bearing for both high school and college credit. In addition to traditional Dual Enrollment, MCCC's Dual Enrollment program includes students in the Gateway to College, Upward Bound, and Gear Up programs. Unduplicated Count of Dual Enrollment (DE) Students Enrolled by Fiscal Year









Student success metrics provide data sets that assist the College in identifying critical milestones such as course, certificate, and degree completion. These metrics can be used to guide retention and student success initiatives.




