Montgomery County Community College Honors International Business Certificate of Completion International Leadership in Action and Discovery Capstone (ILIAD)

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

In this self-paced on-line course offered by Phi Theta Kappa (PTK), students will explore opportunities for experiential international education to identify an opportunity aligned with their personal and career goals. Students will set learning goals, develop a timeline and actions required to meet goals, and develop well-crafted essay drafts that prepare them to complete application processes for programs, as well as scholarships that fund study abroad experiences.

This co-curricular pass/fail course cannot be used to fulfill a degree requirement nor is it calculated in a student's Grade Point Average (GPA); however, it will be transcripted.

PREREQUISITE(S):

Students must have successfully completed or tested out of at least 12 credit hours of College work with a grade point average of 3.5 or better.
