



Dual Admissions Partnership

Students are guaranteed admission to their chosen field of study at Peirce College with a minimum GPA of 2.0. Dual Admissions offers a coordinated transfer from both institutions so an efficient and seamless transfer is achieved.

Q. What is the Dual Admissions Program?

A. An agreement between Peirce College and Montgomery County Community College that provides MCCC graduates who have completed an A.F.A., A.S. A.A., or A.A.S. degree and submitted a Dual Admissions Intent Form automatic admission to Peirce College

Q. How does the Dual Admissions Program Work?

A. 1) Complete the Dual Admissions Intent Form, available at the MCCC Counseling Center at the Central Campus or in Room 151 of West Campus. 2) Return completed Dual Admissions Intent Form to one of the MCCC offices listed on the form. 3) Receive acceptance letter from Peirce as well as periodic mailings apprising you of program updates. 4) Attend initial admissions meeting at Peirce College with Liz Pecora, Dual Admissions Enrollment Specialist

Q. If I complete A Dual Admissions Intent Form, am I obligated to attend Peirce College?

A. No. The Dual Admissions program is simply an opportunity to continue your education with minimal duplication of coursework in the most efficient manner possible.



DUAL ADMISSIONS INTENT FORM

Montgomery County Community College (MCCC) and Peirce College (Peirce) enter into this Dual Admissions Agreement so that students admitted into a designated associate's degree program at MCCC will be admitted into a bachelor's degree program at Peirce on the condition that they graduate from MCCC with an Associate Degree with a minimum GPA of 2.0; complete the Dual Admissions Intent Form; and satisfy all other Peirce College requirements.

By satisfying the conditions of the Dual Admissions Agreement, Peirce College will do the following:

1. Waive the \$50 admissions application fee
2. Award academic scholarships to MCCC students who graduate with a 2.0 GPA or higher
3. Provide the MCCC student with the opportunity to meet with a Peirce representative for assistance with transferring to Peirce (prior to graduating from MCCC).

Transfer Credit Policy

Peirce College, in its sole discretion, may permit the transfer of credits in the following instances:

- The institution where credits are earned holds regional or association accreditation or is a candidate for such accreditation. Peirce College reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to consider transfer credits from non-accredited institutions for courses that are consistent with Peirce College academic standards.
- The courses are applicable to the student's academic program at Peirce and are equivalent to courses that Peirce offers.
- The student received a grade of "C" or better.
- Information Technology courses more than three years old will be reviewed by the IT Faculty Chair to determine if credit will be granted. Developmental courses are not transferable.
- Student may transfer as many as 90 credits into Peirce College.

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
