# **Freshen Up Your Online Presence**

The content of your social media accounts and the results of a google name search create a personal brand of your character. It is important to make sure your online presence portrays a version of you that employers want to hire.

#### Here are a few steps you can take to make your online presence career ready:

#### **Step 1: Clean Up Your Accounts**

- $\checkmark~$  Having a social media presence can help employers know you, so don't delete your accounts, just clean them up.
- $\sqrt{}$  Remove old posts or photos you would not want an employer to see.
- $\sqrt{}$  Remove any items that do not represent you well.
- $\sqrt{}$  Check your privacy settings.
- $\sqrt{}$  Revoke permissions for various games and apps you no longer use.

#### Step 2: Google Yourself



- $\checkmark~$  Review what comes up on the first three pages. This is how you will appear to potential employers.
- $\checkmark~$  If there is negative content, create positive content like a website or blog to "push down" negative content.

#### Step 3: Perform Regular Maintenance



- $\sqrt{}$  Consider removing language that may be considered offensive.
- $\sqrt{}$  Guard your reputation, be aware of the photos and posts you are tagged in.
  - On social media sites, change your settings so that you have to approve any photos/ posts you are tagged in.

#### **Remember:**

- Your digital footprint lasts forever.
- Social media moves fast, don't go viral for something negative or become an internet sensation for something you aren't proud of.
- Be prepared to stand behind anything and everything you publish online.
