COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A study of drawing in different media stressing draftsmanship and creative interpretation. Special emphasis will be placed on understanding the figure and portraiture. In addition to studio work, group discussions and critiques will be provided. This course is subject to a course fee. SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

- 1. Involved Assignments of the Following
 - a. contour lines both broken and continuous
 - b. full-tone conté and/or charcoal
 - c. introduction of review of the use of line groupings with graphite pencil, pen and ink or magic marker
 - d. increases emphasis on careful handling of the tools
- 2. Figure Work
 - a. Scribble gesture (one or two minute poses), for the purpose of:
 - 1) contour line
 - 2) full tone studies in graphite, charcoal, or conté both short and longer poses
 - 3) self-portrait study
 - 4) careful studies of hands and feet
