### Montgomery County Community College ART 267 Kiln Building 3-2-2

## COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course covers the history, design, development and construction of kilns. It will introduce the student to the construction skills involved in building kilns, such as welding, mortaring bricks, cutting bricks and working with refractory fiber materials.
