SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

- 1. Introduction of goals and topics supporting an understanding of an expansion of processes explored in Printmaking I.
- 2. Introduction of a broad range of advanced printmaking techniques, including: relief, intaglio and collagraphy.
- 3. Introduction of an expansion of the review of the history of printmaking introduced in Printmaking I, presented to provide a stronger basis for evaluating prints.
- 4. Expansion of a personal portfolio of original work created in Printmaking I, demonstrating a grasp of advanced techniques introduced.

LEARNING MATERIALS:

Carving tools, linoleum blocks, copper plates, etching needle and burnisher, chip board, modeling paste, gesso, printmaking paper, vinyl gloves, rags.
