# Montgomery County Community College ART 286 Illustration II 3-2-2

# COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to advance the skills and concepts introduced in Illustration I with an emphasis on enhancing the development of a personal artistic style. Examples of historically relevant and contemporary artwork and a variety of materials and techniques will be explored and evaluated. Projects will be designed to advance the grasp of visual problems specific to illustration, including the vital connection between image and text, narrative, and the aesthetic challenges of developing unique creative visualizations.

### SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

- 1. Exploring options in the development of a personal style while completing assignments of a problem-solving nature
  - a. Evaluating one's own work and work by historically and contemporary relevant artists/illustrators
  - b. Generation of alternative options
  - c. Exploration of sequential imagery, which may include:
    - Children's books
    - Narrative/graphic novels
    - Short animation sequences/storyboards
    - Artist books
    - Editorial illustration as applicable to serial imagery

### 2. Workflow

- a. Research
- b. Visualization Techniques
  - Roughs, "Comps," Revisions
- c. Materials and Techniques
  - Exploration of options in traditional and/or digital media
- d. Final delivery to Client/Personal Portfolio
  - Image presentation, electronic delivery
  - Exploration of relevant social media and other options for creating

an online presence.

• Written communication relevant to expressing one's process and/or goals for use for transfer to a four-year program or to enhance one's personal journal and/or online presence.
