# Montgomery County Community College COM 286 Live TV Production 3-2-2

### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Students explore the creative process and aesthetics for producing and directing multi-camera live-studio programming. Students design, produce, direct, light, schedule, and budget for live programs. These projects include serial dramas and comedy, talk shows, sporting events, political debates, public-affairs, and news programs. Students analyze and critique current live television productions, apply theory, identify and discuss aesthetics, and determine trends. Students produce their own creative projects individually and as part of a production team. This course is subject to a course fee.
