# Montgomery County Community College EDU 213 Working with Children with Special Needs 3-3-0

#### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Working with Children with Special Needs (EDU 213) provides students with an overview of the historical perspective, as well as current issues and practices, related to special education. Students will learn about laws that affect students with special needs and the classification of exceptionalities identified by the laws. Students will acquire knowledge of definitions, terminology, and assessment tools that relate to special education. The focus will be on the types of educational approaches that teachers use to support students with special needs in order to ensure their success. Students will engage in observation hours during this course.

Prerequisites: Completion of, or concurrent registration in, *EDU 100 (Introduction to Education)*.

### COURSE COMMENT:

- The course requires students to complete 4 hours of field experience/observation special education setting or a co-taught inclusion classroom that has students with IEPs.
- Students must apply for background clearances & be fingerprinted prior to observations. These are legal requirements for this course. Clearances include:
  - Federal (FBI) Criminal History Background Check
  - Act 34 (PA Criminal) Background Check
  - Act 151 (Child Abuse) Background Check
  - Mandated Reporter Training
  - NSOR/ National Sex Offender Verification
