Montgomery County Community College EMP 100 Emergency Planning 3-3-0

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course will introduce the student to the concepts of Emergency and Crisis Planning. The course provides a conceptual overview of planning as a means to anticipate, prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from any incident. The course will analyze the planning process in its constituent parts, such as hazard analysis, resource assessment, plan development, coordination with others, and plan implementation, training, and education. Students will work in an interactive program to establish a planning process for companies or municipalities. Students will learn from actual case experiences, and will sharpening their understanding and relevant skills.
