Aggregated results will be submitted to the Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs. The benchmark for each learning outcome is that 70% of students will meet or exceed outcome criteria.

SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

The sequence of topics will be entirely dependent upon the individual needs and progress of the student. Every student will receive instruction in the following areas of music performance, tailored to their particular instrument or voice:

- Performance technique (such as: breathing, touch, embouchure, etc)
- Intonation
- Articulation
- Phrasing
- Stylistic interpretation
- Other performance issues as identified by the instructor in the initial evaluation

LEARNING MATERIALS:

The instructor will assign appropriate materials for each student. Sheet music and exercise books are available through area music stores, and through online retailers.

Other learning materials may be required and made available directly to the student and/or via the College's Libraries and/or course management system.
