**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Chamber Strings IV is a performance course for students who want the opportunity to participate in an orchestral strings setting. The course focuses on developing technique and breadth of repertoire for string (violin, viola, cello, bass) students. This course is open to all students who possess a basic ability to play an instrument. The ability to read music is required. Students will be evaluated in the first class, and those who are not prepared for ensemble work will be advised to withdraw. This course is subject to a course fee. #### SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

Because this is a performance-based course, the sequence of topics will be different each semester and entirely dependent on the repertoire to be learned; however, possible repertoire and themes may include:

- a. Contemporary String Orchestra Repertoire
- b. Classical Period String Orchestra Repertoire
- c. Eclectic Genres, Including Multicultural Repertoire
- d. Baroque Period String Orchestra Repertoire
