 Comprehension Strategies for College Reading I
 3-3-0

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to enhance higher level critical reading and thinking skills through extensive guided practice with academic discipline-based and informational readings. Students learn several appropriate problem-solving strategies: analysis, interpretation, and evaluation. Practice and utilization of discipline-specific vocabulary and note-taking are also fostered.

SEQUENCE OF TOPICS:

1. Course Introduction
2. Incorporating reading as a process. Select, apply and evaluate textbook study strategies such as the following:
 - A. Before reading activate prior knowledge, set a purpose, preview text structure
 - B. During reading highlight, annotate, take notes, monitor comprehension
 - C. After reading: summarize, create question/answer sheets, create practice exams, construct study guidelines
 - D. Notetaking
3. Evaluating inferences and implications
4. Investigating different points of view
 - A. Explore perspectives and points of view
5. Identifying critical points in arguments
 - A. Recognize and identify assumptions and biases
 - B. Identify errors in reasoning
 - C. Recognize, analyze and evaluate the soundness of arguments
 - D. Evaluate evidence and draw conclusions
6. Critically analyzing readings
7. Information Literacy
 - A. Implement informational search strategies to locate a variety of sources
 - B. Evaluate websites
